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- Action:

  - Confirmed Youth Behavioral Health Coordination Pilot as an Early Win
  - Implemented the Youth Marijuana Prevention and Education Program
  - Developed Decision Makers Talking Points
  - Learned about legal entity options – Moving forward to develop an LLC.
  - Engaged with tribes and visited the Skokomish Tribal Health Center

# CPAA Highlights from 2016

# Youth Marijuana Prevention and Education Program

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- Developed stronger partnerships in the region

# Youth Behavioral Health Coordination Pilot

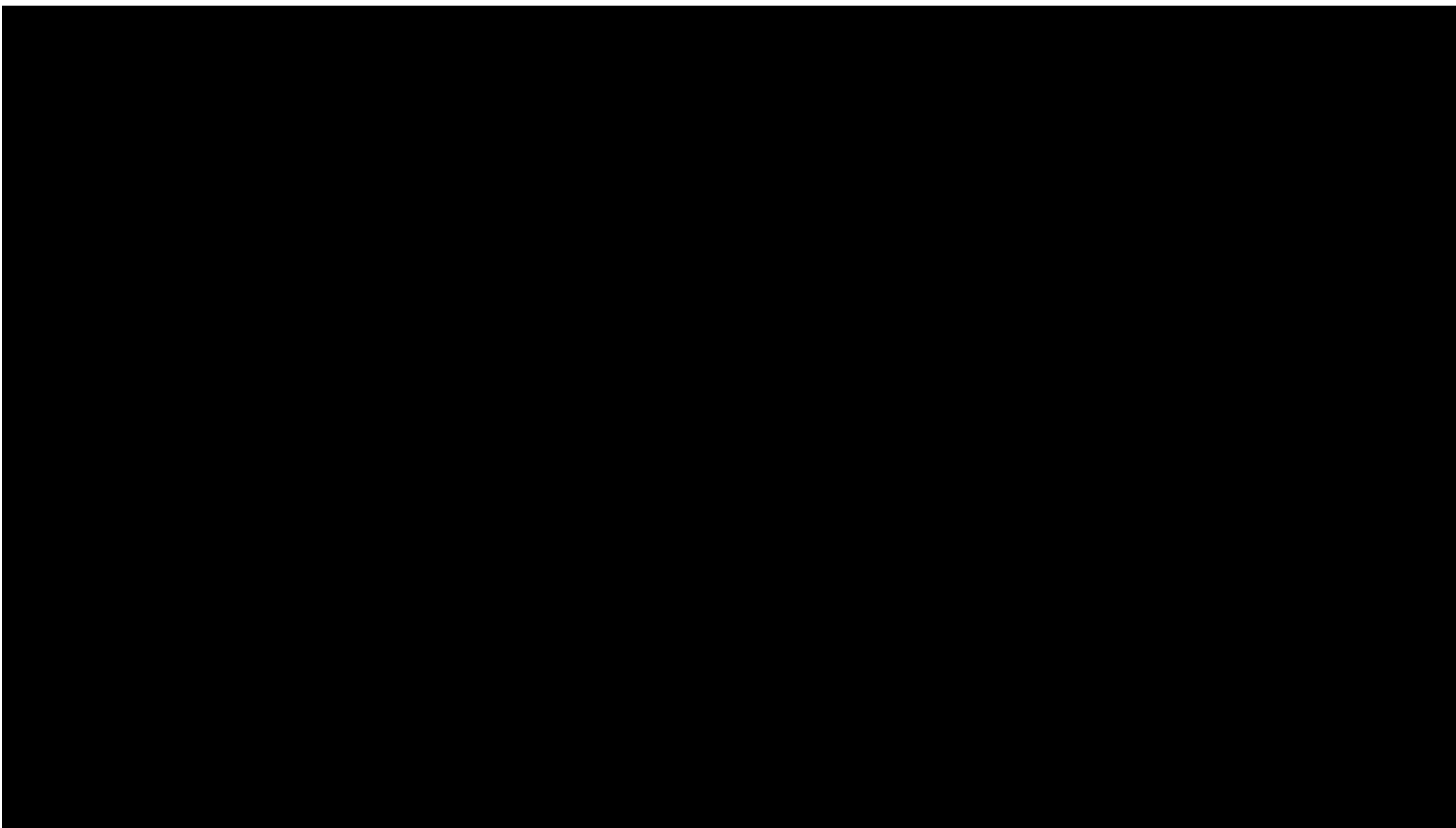
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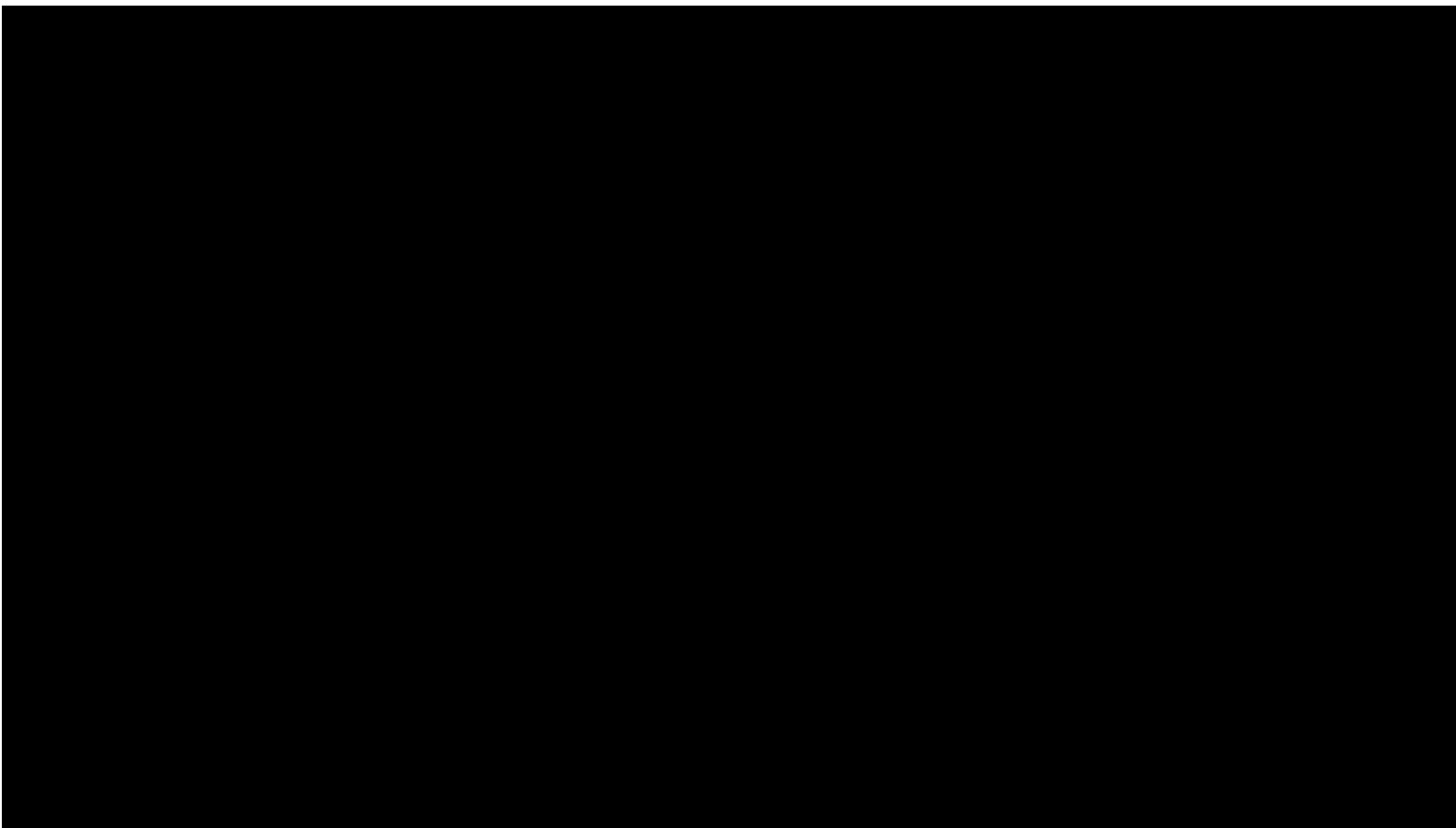
- Developed regional work flows, logic model, and identified data metrics
- All four sites received funding to hire staff
  - Funders: BHOs and Schools
  - Three out of four sites have percentage of funding received from the schools
  - Cambia Health Foundation application submitted for additional funding to support schools
- Hired staff to help provide care coordination
- Shout out: Partners who are able to make this happen.

# Youth Behavioral Health Pilot Project: 2015 to 2016 School Year

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- Monticello Middle School in Longview, WA (Cowlitz County)
  - Number of students enrolled in 2015 – 2016 school year: 472
    - Number of students engaged in Care Coordination: 34
    - Number of students engaged with Behavioral Health Services: 34
    - Number of students connected to PCP/Medical Home: 47
    - 21 (34%) of the students engaged in Care Coordination had decreased referrals for discipline
